#### **ARTIST IN RESIDENCE: KATIE PRETTI**

Part of Ctrllab's Home, Paralleled exhibition for the Art Matters Festival, Montreal Art House Resident artist, Katie Pretti, will create Reckless Abandonment, a painting-in-the-round. During her stay in the month of March, Pretti will examine the contradictory sensations of emancipation and despair associated with leaving, or deserting, a person or place, ironically, through the construction of a free-standing, room-like, structure. Evidence of the construction process will gradually be added during the Home, Paralleled project as the artist spontaneously re-creates her practice in response to the foreign surroundings. The Reckless Abandonment solo exhibit will be presented from March 25th-31st by apointment, with an open finnissage Thursday, March 31st from 7:30-10pm.


Pretti has held studios in Brooklyn and Buenos Aires. Her first publication, a book of drawings entitled *Sonority of Words*, was launched in Toronto by Art Metropole, featured at the 2007 NYC Art Book Fair, and subsequently added to the collection of The National Gallery of Canada. Pretti was also recently featured in the *Carte Blanche Volume 2: Painting* survey of Canadian painters and her work can be seen on the cover of Anvil Press' new release *The Devil You Know*, short stories by Jenn Farrell. 






